## Europe Dengue will 'take off' in southern Europe, US, Africa this decade, WHO says

Dengue fever is poised to emerge as a significant threat in the southern United States, southern Europe, and new regions in Africa during this decade, warns a World Health Organization's (WHO) Chief Scientist. This alarming projection is driven by rising global temperatures, creating conducive conditions for the mosquitoes that carry the dengue virus.

Dengue fever has long been a health concern in parts of Asia and Latin America, causing an estimated 20,000 deaths annually. Global dengue cases have surged eight-fold since 2000, primarily due to climate change, increased human mobility, and urbanization. In 2022 alone, 4.2 million dengue cases were reported worldwide, and public health officials anticipate near-record transmission levels this year, with Bangladesh facing its worst-ever outbreak, resulting in over 1,000 deaths. Jeremy Farrar, an infectious diseases specialist, emphasizes the urgent need for proactive discussions and preparation to manage the growing dengue threat.

He highlights that dengue is likely to become endemic in parts of the United States, Europe, and Africa, where limited local transmission has already occurred. This situation will place immense pressure on healthcare systems in affected countries. Farrar's extensive experience in combating tropical diseases, including dengue, and his current role at the WHO underscore the urgency of addressing this emerging global health challenge exacerbated by climate change. Most people who get dengue do not have symptoms, meaning case rates are thought to be far higher than the reported numbers. Those who do can experience fever, muscle spasms and joint pain so severe it is known as "break-bone fever." In severe cases – less than 1% - it can be fatal. There is no specific treatment for dengue, although there is a vaccine available. Earlier this week, the WHO recommended Takeda Pharmaceuticals' Qdenga vaccine for children aged 6 to 16 in areas where the infection is a significant public health problem. Qdenga is also approved by the EU regulator, but Takeda withdrew its application in the United States earlier this year, citing data collection issues. Takeda said it was still in talks with the US Food and Drug Administration about the vaccine.

#### Hyundai Electric Vehicles to Add North American Charging Standard

Hyundai Motor North America has announced its adoption of the North American Charging Standard (NACS) ports for electric vehicles (EVs) in the United States and Canada. Starting in Q4 2024, all-new or refreshed Hyundai EVs in the United States will exclusively feature NACS ports, with Canada following suit in the first half of 2025. This move will provide Hyundai EVs with access to more than 12,000 Tesla Superchargers across the United States, Canada, and Mexico, effectively doubling the DC fast charging network available to Hyundai EV users.

The collaboration with Tesla marks a significant milestone in Hyundai's commitment to delivering exceptional EV experiences. The partnership aims to instill confidence in Hyundai EV owners by ensuring convenient charging access. Additionally, it complements the joint venture to establish a new high-powered charging network with a target of at least 30,000 stations across North America.

Owners of existing and future **Hyundai EVs equipped** with the current CCS (Combined Charging System) will gain access to the **Tesla Supercharging Network starting in Q1 2025**, facilitated by Hyundai-provided adapters. Moreover, Hyundai will make adapters available to enable NACS-equipped vehicles to charge at CCS chargers.

This expansion aligns with Hyundai's **broader strategy to** ensure that EV drivers have access to an extensive charging infrastructure. In partnership with six global automakers, Hyundai is working on **creating a high-powered North American charging network**, with the first U.S. stations expected to open in **the summer of 2024, followed by Canada at a later stage.**

#### India In Talks With South American & African Nations To Introduce UPI

India is engaged in discussions with several South American and African nations to implement the Unified Payment Interface (UPI) and RuPay cards as payment platforms in these regions, according to a senior government official. These negotiations are at various stages, reflecting India's efforts to expand the use of UPI internationally. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the National Payments Corp. of India (NPCI) are collaborating with various countries, high commissions, and embassies in these endeavors.

Ritesh Shukla, the CEO of NPCI International Payments Limited (NIPL), has recently stated that the number of countries where UPI is operational will double in the next 12-18 months. The government aims to popularize and globalize RuPay and UPI, transforming them into global products. In August, UPI transactions in India surpassed 10 billion. Additionally, the RBI is planning to introduce a wholesale central bank digital currency (CBDC) in the interbank borrowing market, particularly in the call money market. This market allows banks to borrow funds from each other for short-term liquidity needs. The wholesale CBDCs are being tested to explore various technologies, including their use as tokens for call money settlement.



The RBI initiated pilot testing of CBDCs in both wholesale and retail segments, with a goal of achieving one million daily CBDC transactions by December 2023. These pilots aim to assess the benefits, risks, and impact on bank deposits and monetary policy. Interbank call money market is a short-term money market allowing financial institutions like banks, mutual funds, and corporations, to lend and borrow money at interbank rates. "The purpose of wholesale CBDCs has been to try out different technologies. Going forward, we will try other technologies, like using CBDCs as tokens for call money settlements," he added. "Experimenting with technology is relatively easier for wholesale CBDC pilots," he said. The purposes of CBDC pilots are to understand the benefits, risks, and impact that we may have on bank deposits, monetary policy, among others," the official said.

Sri Lanka hosted the crucial Council of Ministers Meeting of the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) on October 11, with participation from senior leaders of 16 countries, including India's External Affairs Minister, S. Jaishankar. The IORA's Council of Ministers is the highest decision-making body of the organization, which is the largest and most prominent regional body in the Indian Ocean Region, comprising 23 member countries and 10 dialogue partners.

During the meeting, Sri Lanka will take over the chairmanship of IORA for the period 2023 to 2025. The event will saw the presence of 16 ministers, including foreign ministers from countries such as Bangladesh, India, Iran, Mauritius, Malaysia, and South Africa. Additionally, ministerial and senior-level representatives from Australia, Comoros, France, Indonesia, Kenya, Madagascar, Maldives, Mozambique, Oman, Seychelles, Singapore, Somalia, Tanzania, Thailand, United Arab Emirates, and Yemen (member countries) attended along with representatives from China, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Germany, Italy, Japan, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, Turkey, the UK, and the United States of America (dialogue partners).

Australia-US Ink Multibillion-Dollar Defense Deal

An independent report reveals that the Australian and US Defence Departments will invest over \$6 billion in the Northern Territory, leading to significant economic growth and job creation in the region. The report, titled "Billion Dollar Partnership," was produced by ACIL Allen and commissioned by Master Builders Northern Territory. It outlines that this substantial investment will be made over the next five years, resulting in the creation of 7,500 additional jobs and boosting the economic growth of the Northern Territory by nearly five percent. The investment will be directed toward 25 defense projects in the Territory, with data provided by the **Department of Defence**. The report also highlights the capacity of the construction sector in the Northern Territory to deliver these projects. This significant investment aligns with the Defense Strategic Review's emphasis on the strategic importance of northern Australia and the need to strengthen and expand bases and facilities in the Northern Territory. It represents a major partnership between the Australian and US Defence Departments and the construction sector, promising economic benefits for the entire region. The report highlights the progress that the Federal Government and the Department of Defense are making in response to the **Defense Strategic Review (DSR)**.

"The DSR amplified the vital strategic importance of northern Australia and strengthening and expanding bases and facilities in the Northern Territory. It's great news that such substantial progress is being made toward the achievement of that objective," Chief Executive of Master **Builders Northern Territory Ben Carter said** 



#### **Africa**

#### UN security council and AU peace and security meeting opens in Addis Ababa

The annual meeting between member countries of the UN Security Council (UNSC) and the AU Peace and Security Council (PSC) is taking place in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The meeting aims to address critical issues related to the funding of the AU's peacekeeping operations in Africa. AU Peace and Security Commissioner Bankole Adeoye urged participants to focus on ensuring predictable, adequate, flexible, and sustainable funding for AU peacekeeping efforts in Africa. This has been a long-standing issue, with African countries calling for financing through compulsory contributions from UN member states. Negotiations on a draft resolution addressing this issue have been ongoing since 2018, but progress has been slow. The AU has struggled to finance its peace operations, relying heavily on external partners like the European Union.

UN Secretary-General António Guterres' representative to the AU, Parfait Onanga-Anyanga, https://www.africanews.com/2023/10/05/unexpressed hope that the discussions would lead to a framework resolution that replaces the security-council-and-au-peace-and-securitycurrent ad hoc financing arrangement. Guterres emphasized the need for African-led meeting-opens-in-addis-ababa/ responses to threats to peace and security on the continent, funded by mandatory contributions.

Some UNSC members have raised concerns about the types of operations to be financed (e.g., peacekeeping or anti-terrorist missions) and questions related to criminal liability in cases of abuse. The two councils will also discuss the security situation in various African regions, including Sudan, the Sahel, Somalia, and the Democratic Republic of Congo, highlighting the ongoing challenges and crises on the continent.
